

BREAST CANCER SURVIVOR

Laura Birdwell, a downtown Nashville resident and breast cancer survivor, shared her cancer journey with us.

When were you diagnosed? What led you to believe something was unusual?

February 12 is a date that I will never forget. That was the day I was told that I have breast cancer. I'm 31 years old and never thought twice of having cancer. A little backstory, I found a lump when I was 17 years old that ended up being benign (fibroadenoma). Throughout the next few years, those benign lumps kept popping up. Because of this, I went for breast exams twice a year. It was at my regularly scheduled exam that my nurse found the new lump.

What was your reaction when you were told, "You have cancer"?

To be honest, I already had a gut feeling that it was cancer. I had a biopsy on February 7 and had to wait until the 12 for results. So I did that thing that you should never do, and went to "Dr. Google." It still was not easy when the news was confirmed that I, in fact, had breast cancer. My mom was in the room with me, and I think both of our hearts just sank. She went out to the waiting room to get my dad and when he walked in, I just fell into him. I'm so lucky to have had them there with me. They are my rocks.

Is there a history of breast cancer in your family?

My mother was diagnosed with breast cancer four years ago. She's the strongest women I know. She was lucky to have caught it early and is doing great

today. I did have the BRCA gene test done to make sure that I was not positive for that. It came back that I was negative so thankfully we do not have that gene in our family.

What was the recommended treatment plan for your diagnosis?

My doctor walked in and said that he had just presented my case to a board of doctors and every one of them suggested I have a double mastectomy. After a lot of thought, I decided to listen to my gut and have a double mastectomy. It ended up being the best decision I made. After surgery, we found out that I had five lymph nodes that came back positive for cancer. Because of those nodes being positive, my treatment plan went from just needing surgery, to needing chemo and radiation.

My doctor told me because of my age and the fact of the positive nodes, that there is not an oncologist on Earth that would not want to "throw the kitchen sink" at me. So that is what we did. I finished chemo on September 5 and will begin radiation this month.

What message do you want to share to inform other women (and men) about breast cancer awareness?

Get to know your body. Know when something doesn't feel right. Early detection is key. Do not miss any doctor's appointments. Don't wait until you are 40 to get a mammogram. If you have a family history of breast cancer, I would highly suggest you get tested for the BRCA genes. If a doctor doesn't think you need a mammogram until you are 40, find a different doctor. Always speak up. It can save your life.

I also would like to add that I hope soon they will come up with a better exam that will detect breast cancer in younger women. MRIs seem to be the best exam; however, it is so expensive. It's really disheartening to hear from so many women that were turned away from having an MRI because they either couldn't afford it or their doctor said they do not need an MRI. With mammograms, a lot of times younger breast tissue makes it hard to see abnormalities.

Have you had an opportunity to utilize any services of the American Cancer Society?

The American Cancer Society has an easy-to-use website, cancer.org, that really helped me to understand my diagnosis. I have had many friends that have gotten a free (and amazing looking!) wig from the ACS. Not to mention the phone calls I receive from them just checking to make sure I'm doing well and inviting me to events.

Why should folks come out and walk at Making Strides Against Breast Cancer on Nov. 3?

I cannot think of a better, more fulfilling, way to spend your time then walking among survivors and those going through this crappy disease. The women I have met in this short time are the most inspirational women I've ever met. It is a pleasure to raise money for the ACS. Knowing every dollar and every step you take on the walk is working towards saving lives is an incredible feeling.

What else would you like to add, such as words of inspiration — favorite quotes or songs, for example?

"Life will test you but remember this, when you walk up a mountain your legs get stronger." I saw this quote on Pinterest and I love it. I have never felt as strong as I do today. I have so many people come up to me and say, "I don't know how you stay so strong. I wouldn't be that strong." I tell them yes you would. You never know how strong you are until you have no choice but to be strong. We all have it in us.



What is your favorite part about the City Club?



Ingredients:

1 lb Mussels or Clams

8 oz Smoked Trout

1 qt Fish stock/clam juice

1 qt Heavy cream

1 Yellow onion, small dice

3 stalks of Celery, small dice

1 stick Unsalted butter

2 Idaho potato peeled, medium diced

1 garlic clove minced

2 fresh thyme sprigs

½ teaspoon of red pepper flake

1/4 cup All purpose flour

1.5 teaspoon Kosher salt

1/2 teaspoon Black pepper

1 bay leaf

1 cup white wine

Hot Seasoning:

Cayenne Pepper - 2 tablespoons

Smoked Paprika - 1 tablespoon

Brown Sugar - 1 tablespoon

Garlic Powder - 1 teaspoon

Onion powder – 1 teaspoon

Combine mussels/clams and fish stock with wine, bay leaf, thyme and red pepper flakes. Simmer for 5 to 7 minutes until mussels have opened up completely. Strain and reserve the stock and mussels separately. In a clean stock pot melt butter on low heat. Saute onions, celery, and garlic until translucent, add potatoes and saute for another 2 minutes. Add flour and stir to coat the vegetables evenly. Cook for 2 more minutes. Add stock, heavy cream and bring to a simmer. Simmer for 20 - 25minutes until potatoes are tender. Shred the smoked trout with a fork to desired consistency (I prefer it to be a little chunkier). Add the trout and mussels to soup once it's done.

To serve, top soup with a sprinkling of the Nashville hot seasoning and serve with oyster crackers.





ood trucks have become a lunch staple for many living and working downtown, so we decided to review one of the newest ones in town. Chang Noi is an Asian food truck offering classic and unique choices in the Asian food niche, boasting that they are not just a basic Asian food truck, but instead are "Thai Lao fusion." Some of the menus classic choices include Pho, Pad Thai, and Drunken Noodles, while some unique options are Hawaiian Fried Rice Tofu, Flaming Red Curry, and Asian Tacos. All choices have a fusion flare and all have the option of Asian level heat! Chang Noi has five levels of heat options. There's a level of spicy for everyone. You can get non-spicy options all the way to Asian Hot. How hot is Asian Hot? Hotter than I've had at any Asian spot so far. The notable thing about Chang Noi's Asian Hot


heat, however, is that it still has immense flavor, verses most of the high spice items I have had that sacrifice flavor to create the pain of the heat.

What's our verdict on Chang Noi's Thai Lao Fusion? Delicious! Our hands-down favorite was the Asian Tacos. That was the big win across the board with everyone who's tried them. The avocado Asian fusion sauce is to die for, and to pair them with a side of non-fried spring rolls is a must. It may be a weekly go-to meal for me.

Interview with Terrazzo Resident Wilson Pruitt

Tell us about you/your family. How long have you lived in the Downtown Nashville area?

I was born and raised in Nashville and have lived in my unit for a year and a half.

Did you design/decorate/redecorate any rooms in your home?


I did all the interior design myself.

PUTTING IT IN Perspective... investor insight **Public vs. Private Equity** Sources: Bloomberg, Investment Company Institute. National Center for the Middle Market By Alan Hardee, JD, MBA, CFP

Every day we hear in the news about how the stock market is doing. We hear things like, "The market was up 112 points today," and, "The market hit 25,000 for the first time today." What are they really talking about? They're talking about the Dow Jones Industrial Average, which only reflects the stock prices of the 30 largest U.S. companies...huge companies like Exxon, Verizon, IBM, Disney, and Apple.

We also hear about how the S&P 500 is performing, which is a better reflection of how the stock market is doing since it's an index comprised of the 500 largest U.S. companies, not just the top 30.

Taking it a bit further, there are about 3,700 U.S. companies that are publicly traded on the New York Stock Exchange or the NASDAQ. That means that regardless of whether you're a do-itvourself investor or have an investment account with a broker, you have about 3,700 U.S. stocks to choose from when you invest in the stock market. And most stock mutual funds, including mutual funds in most 40lk plans, are investing primarily in these 3,700 companies. So, putting it in perspective, the Dow Jones represents less than 1% of all U.S. stocks that are publicly traded and the S&P 500 represents less than 15% of these publicly traded companies.

Now let's take this a step further. Those 3,700 publicly traded companies, which includes the S&P 500 and the 30 Dow Jones companies, represent less than 2% of all U.S. companies that have at \$10 million or more in annual revenues. The other 98%, over 200,000 companies, are private companies whose stock is not publicly traded, meaning that you can't invest in them through your 40lk or brokerage account unless you work with an investment professional who has access to the private investment world. Many of these private companies are very large, as 87% of companies with 500 employees or more are private companies.

I'll use an analogy to make an important point. If 100 people want to buy a house and only 10 houses are available for sale, the price you're going to pay is likely to be higher and you likely won't get to set the price. This is akin to buying publicly traded stocks. But what if there were 100 houses for sale and only 10 potential buyers? The buyers have more leverage to negotiate price...like private equity firms often do when looking to invest in a private

company. Private equity firms determine the price they're willing to pay for equity in a private company and then they negotiate.

While many investors have portfolios that are limited to investments in that 2%, the public companies, investors who have discovered private equity, i.e., investing in private companies, have transitioned from the children's menu of investing to the adult menu. Finding attractive investment opportunities in a universe of 200,000+ companies is more appealing to us than settling for non-negotiated stock purchases in a universe of only 3,700 companies.




